REPORT ON MISSIONS

Missions is our work, but to more effectively carry out the work. we have divided the work into three parts—District, Home and Foreign Missions. In His last instructions to His church, Jesus Christ said, "But ye shall receive fame after that the Holy Ghest is come upon you; and ye shall be witnesses unto me, both in Jerusalom and

in Judea and in Samaria and unto the uttermost parts of the earth." A church ought to work all the territory it is able to work. But if there is more territory adjacent to it than it can evangelize, then it is wise for it to call on another church to hilp in the work; and thus form an association of churches to carry on the work. Under our present system the work is moving along well. But nothing to compare with our ability. God has put great rich is in our hands and we ought, by His help, evangelize the whole world in a few years. We have eneven foreign missionaries in the field and Brother Gregory has expressed his call to go to China, and will go as soon as the way is made possible. Brother Abernathy has been in China as our missionary for nearly two years and withave paid him this year, \$251.04. One church paid \$103 of this amount, which left less than \$150 for all the rest of the churches to give. If Enon Association hasn't done better than we have, Brother Abernathy has only received \$502.08 for his last year's work in China, which is too small by far.

Brethren, when you go home try to stir up your church along this line.

We also have five or six Home Missionaries, Brothers Massey, Gregory and Stinson. The reports show that there has been very little given to the worthy Brethren. May God help us to make up along this line and do something for God.

RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. The Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 2. A Moderator and Clerk shall be chosen by the members present.
- 3. Only one person shall speak at a time who shall arise and address the Moderator by the Appellation of Bro. Moderator and shall while speaking confine himself to the subject under consideration and shall not be interrupted unless he digress from the subject and shall in no wis reflect on any other speaker, so as to make remarks on his slips, failings or imperfections, but shall fairly state his views without sophristry or criticism.
- 4. No member shall absent himself from the Association without leave of the Moderator.
- 5. No member shall speak more than three times on the same subject without leave of the body. The chairman on each subject shall have an opening speech of ten minutes and two other speeches of five minutes each. All other speakers shall be limited to three speeches to five minutes each.
- 6. Every motion and second shall come under the immediate consideration of the Association, unless withdrawn by the one who made it
- 7. No member shall whisper, laugh or read any book or paper while the Association is in session.
- 8. No member shall address another by any other appellation than that of Brother.
- 9. On the second day it shall be the duty of the Clerk to read the Rules of Decorum and call the roll of members.
- 10. The Moderator shall be entitled the same privilege of speak ing as any other member, provided the chair be filled; but shall have no vote unless the Association be equally divided.
- 11. Any person violating these rules, or at any time manifest ing a spirit contrary to the Gospel, shall be reproved, or such other course be taken with him as the Moderator may think proper, either at his own option or the intimation of any other member.

REPORT ON PROHIBITION

We, your committee on Prohibition, report as fellows: Strong drinks is one of the worst curses that our nation has to contend with. It causes more trouble and heart aches than any other thing. Therefor we would urge our brethren, for the take of our native churches, and the rising generation, to do everything that we can by voting, working and praying to put down the use of same. Our nation and churches are depending on the sober men to lead them to a higher life. So let us Baptists join in and do all we can to support the cause of temperance.
