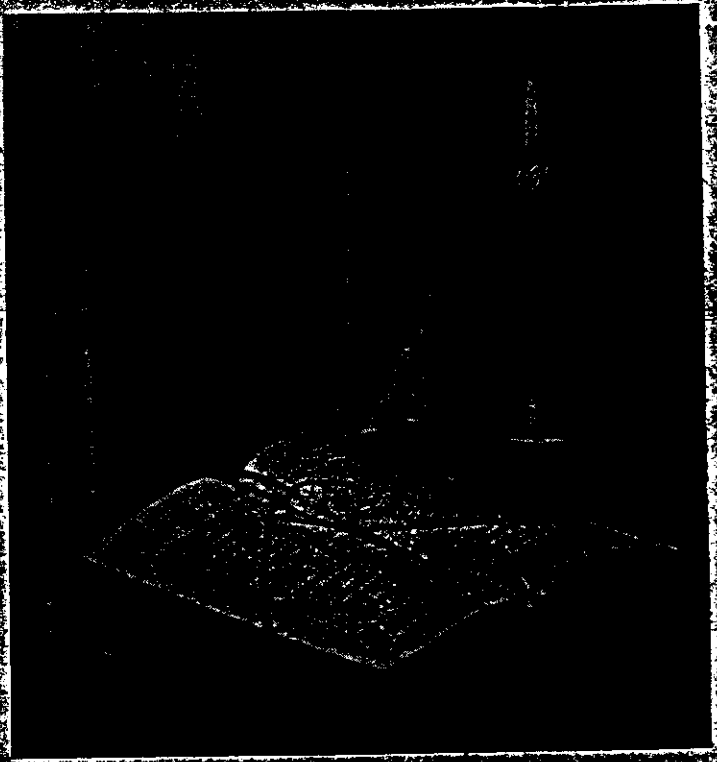

CONSTITUTION

Article I. This body shall be known as Wiseman Association.

Article II. These Associations shall be composed of members duly chosen by regular and orderly Missionary Baptist Churches within our bounds.

Article III. The letters from churches to the Association shall give the number of members in fellowship, received by experience and baptism, received by letter, restored, excommunicated, and dead, since last annual meeting.

Article IV. Each Church shall be entitled to three messengers.

Article V. These Associations shall elect annually as officers, a Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer, whose duties shall be to serve their brethren in their several capacities.

Article VI. These Associations shall never interfere with the Independence of any Church, or claim any ecclesiastical power or rights of supervision over any of the Churches.

Article VII. It shall be the object of these Associations to promote the union of the faith of the Gospel with our educational and mission interests.

Article VIII. These Associations shall meet annually on Friday at 10 o'clock A.M., after the third Sunday in October, and continue two days, the meetings to be held at such places as may be agreed upon by the Association at its annual sitting.

Article IX. A majority of the members of any regular meeting shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Article X. It is expected that these meetings will be missionary in practice as well as theory.

Article XI. New Churches may be admitted into the Association who shall petition by letter and messengers, and on examination, if found orthodox and orderly, may be received and made known by the Moderator giving the right hand of fellowship to the Messenger or Messengers present.

Article XII. The Association may exclude from the union any Church or Churches that are heterodox in principle or disorderly in practice.

Article XIII. No proceedings shall be had against any Church except on charges preferred by a Sister Church, which shall first have followed the direction of Matthew 18:15, in attempting to bring it to repentance.

Article XIV. The Association, at its sitting may welcome any visiting brethren present, who shall have liberty to join in the discussion of any report listed in the Order of Business, but shall have no vote in any action of the association.

Article XV. Any alteration may be made to this Constitution at any regular meeting, by a majority vote of the members present.

Article XVI. That all questions arising before this Association be decided by a majority vote of the messengers present, except in the reception of churches into our fellowship, and that such reception be by a two-thirds vote of messengers present.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. The Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.
2. A Moderator and a clerk shall be chosen by the members present.
3. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall arise and address the Moderator by the appellation of Brother Moderator, and shall, while speaking, confine himself to the subject under discussion and shall not be interrupted unless he digress from the subject; and shall in no wise reflect on any other speaker, so as to make remarks on his slips, failing or imperfections, but shall fairly state his views without sophistry or criticism.
4. No member shall absent himself from the Association without leave of the Moderator.
5. No member shall speak more than three times on the same subject without leave of the body. The chairman on each subject shall have an opening speech of ten minutes and two other speeches of five minutes each.
6. Each motion and second shall come under the immediate consideration of the Association, unless withdrawn by the one who made it.
7. No member shall address another by any appellation other than that of Brother.
8. On the first day, immediately upon permanent organization, it shall be the duty of the clerk to read the Rules of Decorum. A roll call of messengers shall be made on the second day.
9. The Moderator shall be entitled to the same privilege of speaking as any other member, providing the chair be filled, but shall have no vote unless the Association be equally divided.
10. Any member violating these rules, or at any time manifesting a spirit contrary to the Gospel shall be reproved or such other course taken with him as the Moderator may think proper, either at his own option or the intimation of any other member.

PROCEEDINGS

FIRST DAY – FRIDAY, OCTOBER 24, 1980

The Wiseman Baptist Association came together in its 90th annual session on the above date at 10:00 A.M. with New Bethel Missionary Baptist Church, 1088 Old Dickerson Pike, Goodlettsville, Tennessee.

Services began with singing, led by Bro. Jake Lambert, and accompanied at the piano by Bro. Bobby Vanderpool. "The Eastern Gate" and "I Can Hear Them Singing Over There," was sung. Remarks relative to our meeting, its purpose and work, and the fellowship among us were made by the moderator. This annual assembling of our Missionary Baptist Churches certainly is one of the highlights of our work. The moderator read Psalm 133:1-3, for a devotional. Elder W. T. Russell, moderator of Siloam Baptist Association, led the congregation in prayer. After singing "When I've Traveled My Last Mile," Elder H. C. Vanderpool, pastor of host church, made some remarks in welcoming everyone to the association, and made some announcements relative to the committees of the church in arrangements made to entertain the session.

The moderator introduced Elder Everett Scruggs, the appointee, to preach the Introductory Sermon. Bro. Scruggs expressed his thanks and appreciation for the opportunity of preaching this sermon before the association. He read for a lesson, Ephesians 1:1-12. He then led the congregation in prayer. His theme was "God's Purpose For Choosing Us."

His first scripture references were Isaiah 46:9; II Timothy 1:9; Titus 1:3 and Psalm 90:1. In studying these Bible references, Bro. Scruggs pointed out how God's eternal plan was from the foundation of the world. From the book of Genesis, God's creation of the world was reviewed, which fit into His plan and purpose of the human race for time and eternity. Quoting Psalm 48 and Job 38:4, the speaker gave references to prove that God had a purpose for all creatures and elements of the universe. All things were created for man's benefit and for God's glory, Hebrews 2:6 and Ephesians 3:9.

Bro. Scruggs gave Ephesians 3:21, where Paul said God would have glory by Christ Jesus in the church throughout all ages, world without end. True churches are composed of true, born-again, children of God, which are created in the likeness of God. We become children of God by faith in Christ Jesus, God's sacrifice for us, Genesis 3:15; Galatians 4:4 and Matthew 3:13-17.

The speaker spoke of Christ as he traveled around the area of the Sea of Galilee and Capernaum gathering the disciples of which the church was constituted. He gave I Corinthians 12:28 as to the gifts Christ gave to the church. Bro. Scruggs mentioned Matthew 16:18, where Christ "the Rock" was the foundation of the church.

God's eternal purpose was to reach the lost world with the gospel through His church. The gospel being the power of God unto salvation, the preaching of the death, burial and resurrection of Christ, that lost humanity could be saved through him. While extending the right hand of fellowship to Bro. Scruggs, the congregation sang "Amazing Grace," "My Loved Ones Are Waiting For Me," and "I Am Bound For That City." Moved to adjourn one hour and fifteen minutes for lunch. Carried. After announcements, Elder Harold Carver, moderator of Southwestern District Baptist Association, prayed the benediction and offered thanks for the meal to follow.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON

After a bountiful meal and time of fellowship, services began with singing led by Elder W. R. Overton accompanied at the piano by Sister Helen Perrigo. "Heaven's Jubilee" was sung and the moderator spoke of the enjoyment and fellowship during the noon hour. He read for a devotional lesson Psalm 100:1-5, and asked Elder Henry Smith, pastor of Mt. Calvary Baptist Church in Nashville, to lead in prayer. The congregation then sang, "Better Farther On."

Church letters were called for and filed with the clerk. The moderator appointed Elder Kenneth Davis, of the Siloam Baptist Association and Bro. Ray Smith, clerk of the Southwestern District Baptist Association, as reading clerks.

The elected officers expressed their appreciation to the association for their vote of confidence.

The clerk read the Rules of Decorum.

Petitionary letters were called for and Colorado Missionary Baptist Church, Denver, Colorado; Eastside Missionary Baptist Church, Gallatin, Tennessee; Harvest Missionary Baptist Church, Hendersonville, Tennessee and Parkwood Missionary Baptist Church, Nashville, Tennessee petitioned with letters. Moved and carried that Colorado church be received. A motion to receive Eastside church carried. Moved to table the letter of Harvest church for one year and that a committee consisting of Elder H. C. Vanderpool, Elder James (Pete) Porter and Elder A. G. Gregory investigate the church and make a report. Motion carried. Moved to receive Parkwood Church. Motion carried. The moderator extended the right hand of fellowship to the messengers of the churches accepted. (See list of churches and messengers).

The next item of business was to elect preachers and their alternates for the 1981 sermons.

Elder Guthrie Thompson, Elder Edgar Copeland and Elder Eugene Brown, Jr. were nominated to preach the Introductory Sermon. Moved that nominations cease. Carried. Elder Guthrie Thompson was elected.

Elder Edgar Copeland and Elder P. H. Brooks were nominated to preach the Memorial Sermon. Moved that nominations cease. Carried. Elder Edgar Copeland was elected.

Elder H. C. Vanderpool, Elder J. W. Briley and Elder A. G. Gregory were nominated to preach the Doctrinal Sermon. Moved that nominations cease. Carried. Elder J. W. Briley was elected.

Elder Eugene Brown, Jr. was nominated to be the alternate of the Introductory Sermon. Moved that nominations cease. Carried. Elder Eugene Brown, Jr. was elected.

Elder William House was nominated to be the alternate of the Memorial Sermon. Moved that nominations cease. Carried. Elder William House was elected.

Elder H. C. Vanderpool was nominated to be the alternate for the Doctrinal Sermon. Moved that nominations cease. Carried. Elder H. C. Vanderpool was elected.

The meeting place for 1981 was taken up. Since no church sent an invitation for the 1981 session, it was moved that Elder Howard G. Taylor, Elder H. C. Vanderpool and Elder A. G. Gregory serve as a committee to arrange a place for the next session. Motion carried. (NOTE: The week following Faith Baptist Church No. 1, Nashville, Tennessee voted and extended an invitation to host the 1981 session of the Association. The committee accepted the invitation for the association. See page 1).

MISSIONS

Elder James (Pete) Porter, the assistant moderator, made remarks relative to the good attendance for this night session. He then asked Elder Calvin Perrigo, moderator of Bethel Baptist Association in Indiana, to lead in prayer, after which "I Can Hear Them Singing Over There," was sung. Elder Bobby Gann read the report on Obituaries. Moved the report be adopted.

OBITUARIES

The report on Christian Education was read by Elder J. W. Briley.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

Definition of Education: Act or process of educating, discipline of mind or character through study or instruction. This training is to begin in the home and as soon as the child is old enough to understand. This is a lot younger than you might think. II Tim. 1:5 when I call to remembrance the unfeigned faith that is in thee, which dwelt first in thy Grandmother Lois, and thy Mother Eunice; and I am persuaded that in thee also.

II Tim. 3:15 and that from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus. This is the kind of instructions this world needs today, Home Discipline. Eph. 6-1 Children obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. Some might say, "All don't have Christian Parents," then it casts a greater load on the Church, and maybe some close relative. The attack on the home and the Church today is furious by satan and all his forces. We cannot stick our heads in the sand and pretend we have not this great obligation.

Let us look at the commission our Head and founder gave to his Church, Matt. 28:18-20. The order is make the disciple, baptize, then teaching them to observe all things I have commanded you, and lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Readily you can see, the field of Christian Education in very broad, To observe all things.

In Luke 11, 1 One of his disciples said unto him, Lord, teach us to pray, as

John also taught his disciples. The first teaching a new convert needs is instruction in prayer, this is part of our armour, then instruction in the study of the Word, Heb. 4:12.

Psalms 119:9, wherewithal shall a young man cleanse his way? by taking heed thereto according to thy word. As we saw Timothy was instructed in the word, it produced a good soldier for the Lord, so if we faithfully teach his word, it will produce more Christians today as Timothy. The Bible is our all sufficient rule of faith and practice.

Pastors, we have a very great office of responsibility to fulfill today. Acts 20:28 Take heed therefore unto yourselves, and to all the flock, over the which the Holy Ghost hath made you overseers, to feed the Church of God, which he hath purchased with his own blood.

John 21, 15-19, the Lord said to Peter, feed my lambs and my sheep. A Church will never rise any higher in Christian Education than the man who teaches them. We are to make the teaching clear and interesting, by the aid of the Holy Spirit. II Peter 3:15-16, Peter said, Our beloved brother Paul wrote some things hard to be understood. You will notice, he did not say they could not be understood. He said the unlearned and unstable wrest, as they do also the other scriptures, unto their own destruction.

In Acts 5:42, and daily in the temple, and in every house, they ceased not to teach and preach Jesus Christ.

The Old Union School has provided help for a number of preachers since it began, in the short time we have there each year, we can learn some to help us teach others. Sunday School with competent teachers is a great asset in Christian Education.

The devil is certainly on the job educating his followers.

Rom. 13:11, and that, knowing the time, that now it is high time to awake our of sleep.

Christian Education I Pet. 1:21, we should walk in his steps. It takes training to know the doctrines and principals of Him who said, "Follow Me."

FAITH AND PRACTICE OF TRUE BAPTIST

We, your committee, submit the following report.

The importance of this subject can be better realized when we think of the thousands that have been saved since the days of John the Baptist due to the Faith and Practice of True Baptists.

The spiritual darkness and multitudes of lost souls that surround us today demand the attention of True Baptists today.

In Luke 1:1-4, Luke engages to set forth a declaration of those things most surely believed among the True Baptists of that day as he wrote to Theophilus, and concluded his statement in verse four by stating, "That thou mightest know the certainty of those things wherein thou has been instructed".

Jude, in verse three of his letter to those preserved in Jesus Christ and called, encourages them to be True Baptist when he wrote, "Beloved when I gave all diligence to write unto you of the common salvation it was needful for me to write unto you, and exhort you that ye should earnestly contend for the faith which was once delivered unto the saints".

We believe that Jesus during the days of his personal ministry established his church from the material prepared by John the Baptist, who was a man sent from God for this work, John 1:6, and that material was made by his preaching repentance and baptizing those who brought forth fruit of it, Matt. 3:8. If being baptized by a Baptist with the authority from heaven as John had makes one a Baptist then the material, which he prepared, was Baptist material, and also the cornerstone. Jesus, himself, was a Baptist being baptized by John. Matt. 3:16.

This should be conclusive to show that the Church Jesus set up was a Baptist Church.

In Luke 24:47, Jesus instructs the church at Jerusalem in regard to their faith and practice when he states, "that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in his name among all nations beginning at Jerusalem." True Baptists since that time, have preached and practiced this.

In the commission as given in Matthew 28:18-20, the church was instructed concerning the making and baptizing of disciples, and the things they were to observe.

Here, the Greek for Baptize (Baptizo) means to dip or a putting into. And that it was to be done in the name of the Father, Son, and the Holy Ghost. True Baptists still practice this.

In Matt. 26:26-30, we find one account of the institution of the Lord's Supper as he placed it in his church.

Paul in I Cor. 11:2, instructs the Church at Corinth to keep the ordinances as he had delivered them. We believe this includes the Lords Supper. True Baptists have and should always strive to observe the Lords supper as a memorial of the blood and body of Jesus according to the word of God.

In Eph. 5:1-2, Paul instructs the Church at Ephesus, "Be ye therefore followers of God as dear children; and walk in love, as Christ also hath given himself for us on offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweet smelling savour".

In Gal. 6:1, Paul writes to the Church at Galatia, "Brethren, if a man be overtaken in a fault, ye which are spiritual, restore such an one in the spirit of meekness; considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted."

In II Thes. 3:6, he also writes, "Now we command you, brethren, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that ye withdraw yourselves from every brother that walketh disorderly, and not after the tradition which he received of us."

We as true baptist should seek to walk in the will and commandments of the Lord.

Jesus said, "And why call ye me, Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say?" Luke 6:46.

The importance of practicing the commandments in these scriptures are set

forth in I John 3:22, "And whatsoever we ask, we receive of him, because we keep his commandments, and do those things that are pleasing in his sight."

The question is asked many times these days why don't we have the power we use to have and why don't we see more souls saved. Paul said that he had kept the faith; we still have the same faith. Maybe we should ask ourselves if we are practicing it as we should.

A great example is found in Acts 18:24-28, where Apollos, a man instructed in the way of the Lord, fervent in the Spirit, who spoke and taught diligently the things of the Lord, knowing only the Baptism of John. Evidently, he was in error on the Baptism he administered. Let's see what two true Baptist did in this case. Aquila and Priscilla took him unto them and expanded unto him the way of God more perfectly. A good practice we might take note of.

Thank God for those true Baptist down through the years who have stood for the faith.

Let us as true Baptist today earnestly contend for the faith as we remember the words of Peter in Acts 2:39, "For the promise is unto you, and your children, and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call.

The time arrived for the Doctrinal Sermon. "I Believe," was sung, led by Elder W. E. Massey accompanied at the piano by Sister Helen Perrigo. The moderator presented Elder James (Pete) Porter, who was elected last year, to preach the sermon. Thus, answering Job's question, "How then can man be justified with God?"

He read Matthew 7:21-23, where Jesus spoke of those who would try to be justified by their own works, but would be eternally lost. Truly this was a good sound doctrinal sermon.
