

SERMONS - 1984

CONSTITUTION

Article I. This body shall be known as Wiseman Association.

Article II. These Associations shall be composed of members duly chosen by regular and orderly Missionary Baptist Churches within our bounds.

Article III. The letters from churches to the Association shall give the number of members in fellowship, received by experience and baptism, received by letter, restored, excommunicated, and dead, since last annual meeting.

Article IV. Each Church shall be entitled to three messengers.

Article V. These Associations shall elect annually as officers, a Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer, whose duties shall be to serve their brethren in their several capacities.

Article VI. These Associations shall never interfere with the Independence of any Church, or claim any ecclesiastical power or rights of supervision over any of the Churches.

Article VII. It shall be the object of these Associations to promote the union of the faith of the Gospel with our educational and mission interests.

Article VIII. These Associations shall meet annually on Friday at 10 o'clock A.M., after the third Sunday in October, and continue two days, the meetings to be held at such places as may be agreed upon by the Association at its annual sitting.

Article IX. A majority of the members of any regular meeting shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Article X. It is expected that these meetings will be missionary in practice as well as theory.

Article XI. New Churches may be admitted into the Association who shall petition by letter and messengers, and on examination, if found orthodox and orderly, may be received and made known by the Moderator giving the right hand of fellowship to the Messenger or Messengers present.

Article XII. The Association may exclude from the union any Church or Churches that are heterodox in principle or disorderly in practice.

Article XIII. No proceedings shall be had against any Church except on charges preferred by a Sister Church, which shall first have followed the direction of Matthew 18:15, in attempting to bring it to repentance.

Article XIV. The Association, at its sitting may welcome any visiting brethren present, who shall have the liberty to join in the discussion of any report listed in the Order of Business, but shall have no vote in any action of the Association.

Article XV. Any alteration may be made to this Constitution at any regular meeting, by a majority vote of the members present.

Article XVI. That all questions arising before this Association be decided by a majority vote, except in the reception of churches into our fellowship, and that such reception be by a two-thirds vote.

RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. The Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 2. A Moderator and a clerk shall be chosen by the members present.
- 3. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall arise and address the Moderator by the appellation of Brother Moderator, and shall, while speaking, confine himself to the subject under discussion and shall not be interrupted unless he digress from the subject; and shall in no wise reflect on any other speaker, so as to make remarks on his slips, failing or imperfections, but shall fairly state his views without sophistry or criticism.
- 4. No member shall absent himself from the Association without leave of the Moderator.
- 5. No member shall speak more than three times on the same subject without leave of the body. The chairman on each subject shall have an opening speech of ten minutes and two other speeches of five minutes each.
- 6. Each motion and second shall come under the immediate consideration of the Association, unless withdrawn by the one who made it.
 - 7. No member shall address another by any appellation other than that of Brother.
- 8. On the first day, immediately upon permanent organization, it shall be the duty of the clerk to read the Rules of Decorum. A roll call of messengers shall be made on the second day.
- 9. The Moderator shall be entitled to the same privilege of speaking as any other member, providing the chair be filled, but shall have no vote unless the Association be equally divided.
- 10. Any member violating these rules, or at any time manifesting a spirit contrary to the Gospel shall be reproved or such other course taken with him as the Moderator may think proper, either at his own option or the intimation of any other member.

FRIDAY - OCTOBER 21, 1983

The Wiseman Baptist Association convened in its 93rd annual session with Salem Missionary Baptist Church, Highway 109 North, Gallatin, Tennessee on Friday, October 21, 1983, at 10:00 A.M.

Services began with singing led by Elder L. W. Smith, accompanied at the piano by Sister Katherine Thurman. "When I've Traveled My Last Mile" was sung. The moderator made preliminary remarks concerning our meeting, its purpose, fellowship and our work. He read for a devotional lesson Psalm 24:1-10. Elder C. L. Russell, pastor of the host church, welcomed everyone to the association and made a prayer request for three seriously ill members of Salem church. Other requests were made for those sick in area hospitals. Elder Paul Bryson of Bowling Green, Kentucky led the congregation in prayer. The song, "I'm Bound For That City," was sung.

The moderator presented Elder Charles Patterson, the appointee, to preach the Introductory Sermon.

Bro. Patterson expressed his appreciation for this day and this opportunity, and requested the prayers of God's people.

He read for a lesson Hebrews 11:23-27 and Romans 12:1. His theme was, "It's Decision Time Down At The Crossroads." Bro. Patterson began his message by referring to Moses in Egypt and the bondage of the Israelites. Moses' birth, childhood and related circumstances were used in the basis of his sermon, Exodus 2:1-25.

Bro. Patterson spoke of Moses' mother submitting her infant son into the hands and providence of God. He then brought Moses into the scene as a servant and instrument in the plan and work of God. Moses' time of learning and preparation was mentioned. The decision time down at the crossroads was drawing near for Moses, Hebrews 11:24-27.

The Apostle Paul and his call to the ministry, preparation, etc., was given, Galatians 1:15-17. Bro. Patterson spoke of the need of God's servants making preparation for the Lord's work.

He continued his discourse, speaking of the many sinful temptations before God's people today and how we had the responsibility of choice in going the way of sin and the world, or following God.

Bro. Patterson referred to the time of the deliverance of the Israelites from Egypt, by God's power and Moses' willingness to be used as a servant and leader.

Abraham and the manifestation of his faith by his works, in offering his son Isaac, was used at this time, showing the time of decision down at the crossroads, came to Abraham, Genesis 22:1-19. Bro. Patterson spoke of Jesus and his statement about being a servant, Matthew 20:28. He mentioned all the sacrifices of Jesus in leaving heaven and coming to earth for us and for God's cause, the greatest sacrifice being at Calvary.

Joshua's statement to the Israelites about choice was given, Joshua 24:15. This sermon was well delivered and with much Spiritual zeal. May it be used to bring us all to a deeper devotion to God and His cause.

While singing "Amazing Grace," "Living By Faith," "Just Over In The Glory Land," and "Some Day," the congregation extended the right hand of fellowship to one another and to Bro. Patterson in appreciation for his good sermon.

The church letters had been filed with the clerk, and the moderator appointed Elder W. T. Russell of the Siloam Baptist Association, and Elder Calvin Perrigo of the Bethel Baptist Association as reading clerks.

Then shall the

righteous answer him, saying, Lord, when saw we thee an hungered, and fed thee? or thirsty, and gave thee drink? When saw we thee a stranger, and took thee in? or naked, and clothed thee? Or when saw we thee sick, or in prison, and came unto thee? Elder Howard G. Taylor read the report on Sunday Schools and Prayer Meetings.

SUNDAY SCHOOLS AND PRAYER MEETINGS

Everyone was welcomed to the service and this night session of the association. Visitors were welcomed to our assembly. Elder Ronnie Galloway of Murfreesboro, Tennessee led the congregation in prayer. "Heaven's Jubilee" was sung and the moderator presented Elder William E. Massey who read the report on Obituaries.

OBITUARIES

The clerk read the minutes of Friday and Friday night. Moved the minutes be adopted. The motion carried.

The report on Faith and Practice of True Baptists was read by Elder C. L. Russell.

to practice what we preach. We are taught to earnestly contend for the faith which was once delivered to the saints. Jude 1-3.

The Lord is the God of knowledge and by him actions are weighed, I Sam. 2:3. We are taught to measure our conduct, I Tim. 3:15-16. We need quality before quantity, II Tim. 3:15-16. We believe in full-time services and we have a lot of part-time members.

God gave us the very best that He had, our Saviour, His Son, His church, the Holy Spirit, and His word which teaches us to return a part of that he blesses us with to God with honor and praise. "Honor the Lord with thy substance and with the firstfruits of all thine increase," Proverbs 3:9. Upon the first day of the week lay by in store as God has prospered us.

But this I say, he which soweth sparingly shall reap sparingly, and he which soweth bountifully, shall also reap bountifully, II Corinthians 9:6. Every man according as he purposeth in his heart, so let him give. Not grudgingly, or of necessity, for God loveth a cheerful giver, II Corinthians 9:7.

We are not submitting this report for argument's sake "on the mode" of giving, but let it be with the right purpose in heart, and way the Lord said to give, and that is with honor and praise to his name; the firstfruits of our increase; upon the first day of the week; bring into the storehouse; bountifully, willingly, cheerfully and regularly.

CHURCH DISCIPLINE

We, your committee, submit the following:

We believe that failure to enforce discipline has been a hindrance to many of our churches. Jesus said to his church, "Ye are the light of the world." If the light of his churches is to shine out as it should, the members of those churches must live close to him and keep their lives clean and pure from the slime and filth of the sinful world in which they live. Undisciplined churches are robbed of their power to witness effectively for the Lord, because of sin in their membership.

We belive the church should be kept clean. We also believe that forgiveness is part of discipline. When a church member acknowledges his wrong, it is the duty of the church to forgive and restore him into full fellowship. I Thessalonians 5:14, "Now we exhort you, brethren, warn them that are unruly, comfort the feebleminded, support the weak, be patient toward all men."

Moved the report be adopted. The motion carried after spoken to by Elder Bobby Gann, Elder Bobby Pitt and Elder J. W. Brilev.

Mark 1:22, the doctrine of the stone mountain kingdom.

Jonah in Old Testament times preached repentance, Jonah 3:1-5 and Luke 11:32. Peter preached repentance on the day of Pentecost, Acts 2:38. Paul preached repentance on Mars Hill at Athens, Acts 17:30.

Bro. Vanderpool, referring to his lesson, pointed out that Luke stated that he was "setting forth a declaration of those things most surely believed among us."

True repentance and faith, which brings salvation to sinners, is a doctrine of the stone mountain kingdom. Also, another doctrine of the kingdom is scriptural baptism to the saved. Matthew 3:1-17; John 4:1-2; Mark 16:16; Matthew 28:18-20; Acts

2:37-41; Acts 10:44-48; Acts 8:36-39. Baptism, being one of the two ordinances of the church, is essential to membership in the stone mountain kingdom, the church.

The other ordinance, the Lord's Supper and its observance according to the scriptures, was ably discussed by the speaker. Exodus 12:3-15; Matt. 26:17-30; Mark 14:12-26; Luke 22:1-30; John 13:1-30; I Corinthians 10:15-21; I Corinthians 11:17-30.

Another doctrine believed among us is the "freeness of salvation" and Paul spoke of it in Romans 6:23. That salvation is eternal and is secured eternally, I John 5:4-5; Revelation 3:5.

According to Daniel, the stone mountain kingdom would break into pieces all other kingdoms, and itself would never be destroyed, but stand forever. Daniel 2:35-44; Matthew 16:18; Ephesians 3:21.

Bro. Vanderpool referred to Revelation 19:6-9, John 2:1-2, and said the Bride of Christ, His Church, was The Stone Mountain Kingdom, that all the saved not in the Bride would be present as guests. A chorus of Amens were heard from the congregation.

As Bro. Levy Smith led "Amazing Grace," "I Shall Be At Home With Jesus" and "Just Over In The Glory Land," the congregation came forward and gave Bro. Vanderpool their hand of endorsement of the wonderful message.

Moved to adjourn one hour for lunch. Carried. Bro. Cecil Sherron from Rock Bridge Church, who is 84 years old today, prayed the benediction and offered thanks for the meal. He thanked the Lord for the many times he had been privileged to attend the association and for the many messages he had heard.
