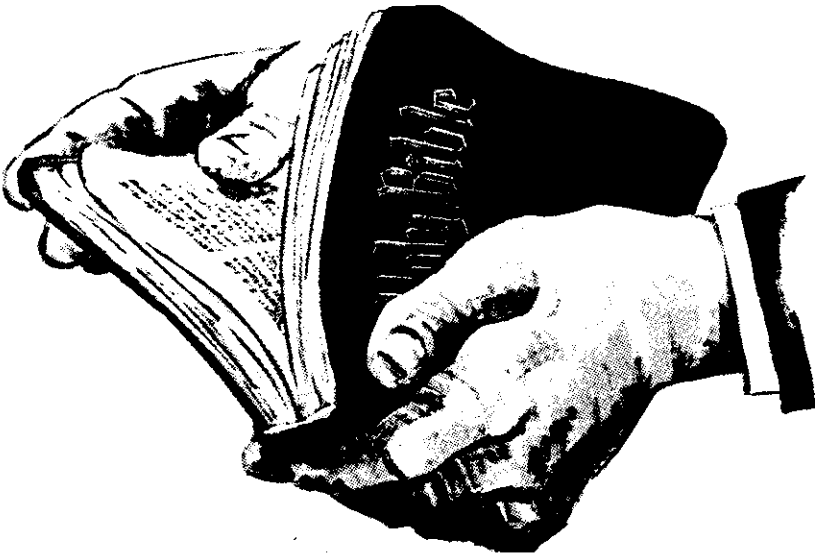

CONSTITUTION

Article I. This body shall be known as Wiseman Association.

Article II. These Associations shall be composed of members duly chosen by regular and orderly Missionary Baptist Churches within our bounds.

Article III. The letters from churches to the Association shall give the number of members in fellowship, received by experience and baptism, received by letter, restored, excommunicated, and dead, since last annual meeting.

Article IV. Each Church shall be entitled to three messengers.

Article V. These Associations shall elect annually as officers, a Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer, whose duties shall be to serve their brethren in their several capacities.

Article VI. These Associations shall never interfere with the Independence of any Church, or claim any ecclesiastical power or rights of supervision over any of the Churches.

Article VII. It shall be the object of these Associations to promote the union of the faith of the Gospel with our educational and mission interests.

Article VIII. These Associations shall meet annually on Friday at 10 o'clock A.M., after the third Sunday in October, and continue two days, the meetings to be held at such places as may be agreed upon by the Association at its annual sitting.

Article IX. A majority of the members of any regular meeting shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Article X. It is expected that these meetings will be missionary in practice as well as theory.

Article XI. New Churches may be admitted into the Association who shall petition by letter and messengers, and on examination, if found orthodox and orderly, may be received and made known by the Moderator giving the right hand of fellowship to the Messenger or Messengers present.

Article XII. The Association may exclude from the union any Church or Churches that are heterodox in principle or disorderly in practice.

Article XIII. No proceedings shall be had against any Church except on charges preferred by a Sister Church, which shall first have followed the direction of Matthew 18:15, in attempting to bring it to repentance.

Article XIV. The Association, at its sitting may welcome any visiting brethren present, who shall have the liberty to join in the discussion of any report listed in the Order of Business, but shall have no vote in any action of the Association.

Article XV. Any alteration may be made to this Constitution at any regular meeting, by a majority vote of the members present.

Article XVI. That all questions arising before this Association be decided by a majority vote, except in the reception of churches into our fellowship, and that such reception be by a two-thirds vote.

Article XVII. If any church fails to represent one or more years, and then desires to reenter the fellowship of this association, there being, evidently, a reason for not representing, there must be a motion for their reentering the Association to be carried by a two-thirds vote. This action is to be taken after permanent organization and at the time to receive petitionary letters.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. The Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.
2. A Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer shall be chosen annually to serve the Association.
3. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall arise and address the Moderator by the appellation of Brother Moderator, and shall, while speaking, confine himself to the subject under discussion and shall not be interrupted unless he digress from the subject; and shall in no wise reflect on any other speaker, so as to make remarks on his slips, failing or imperfections, but shall fairly state his views without sophistry or criticism.
4. No member shall absent himself from the Association without leave of the Moderator.
5. No member shall speak more than three times on the same subject without leave of the body. The chairman on each subject shall have an opening speech of ten minutes and two other speeches of five minutes each.
6. Each motion and second shall come under the immediate consideration of the Association, unless withdrawn by the one who made it.
7. No member shall address another by any appellation other than that of Brother.
8. On the first day, immediately upon permanent organization, it shall be the duty of the clerk to read the Rules of Decorum. A roll call of messengers shall be made on the second day.
9. The Moderator shall be entitled to the same privilege of speaking as any other member, providing the chair be filled, but shall have no vote unless the Association be equally divided.
10. Any member violating these rules, or at any time manifesting a spirit contrary to the Gospel shall be reprovèd or such other course taken with him as the Moderator may think proper, either at his own option or the intimation of any other member.

FRIDAY - OCTOBER 25, 1985

The Wiseman Baptist Association convened in its 95th annual session on the above date with Old Hopewell Missionary Baptist Church near Castalian Springs in Sumner County, Tennessee at 10:00 A.M.

Services began with singing led by Bro. Bob Alexander, accompanied at the piano by Bro. J.W. Gregory. "I Am Bound For That City" and "I Want To Know More About My Lord" were sung. The moderator spoke of God's greatness and mercy toward us, and the privilege we have of this associational body assembling together. He read for a devotional lesson Proverbs 15:1-9. Elder W.T. Russell of the Siloam Baptist Association led the congregation in prayer. The congregation then sang "The Old Country Church."

Elder Johnny Meador, pastor of the host church, welcomed everyone and expressed appreciation for the opportunity of having the association to convene at Old Hopewell.

The moderator presented Elder Gary Duncan, the appointee, to preach the Introductory Sermon. Bro. Duncan expressed his joy over the privilege being given to him as a young minister to stand before the people on this day to preach. He asked for the prayers of the people.

He read for a lesson I Chronicles 28:8-9a. He used for a theme "Spiritual Inheritance." He referred to people's desire to leave an inheritance for their children, generally, of material things. Bro. Duncan emphasized that the greatest inheritance that we could leave our children and grandchildren is a Spiritual inheritance. He quoted from Deuteronomy 4:7-8, where Moses called the attention of the Israelites to the great God whom they served and the inheritance given to them of the Lord.

He also referred to Deuteronomy 6:1-12, where we are obligated to teach our children of God and his plan. That this teaching should be exercised repeatedly. He used Luke 12:13-15 as proof that Spiritual things should hold the greatest interest in our lives, and for our descendants, instead of the material things of the world.

Bro. Duncan said that as elders had the responsibility of teaching the younger, that the younger should respect the elders and heed their teachings. At this time, Job, Chapter 1, was given where Job made offerings for his children, feeling perhaps, they had sinned before God, Job 1:5. Hannah, I Samuel 1:9-28, was given as an example of a Godly woman returning her son to the Lord for his life's work. Timothy, II Timothy 1:5, his mother and grandmother were referred to in manifesting how Godly people had handed down a Spiritual Inheritance from one generation to another.

Bro. Duncan preached a good, sound, Biblical, Baptist message. The congregation shook hands with one another and with Bro. Duncan as a token of appreciation of his sermon, while singing, "Where The Soul Never Dies," "I'm In The Gloryland Way," "Amazing Grace" and "Victory in Jesus."

The church letters having been filed with the clerk, the moderator appointed Elder Calvin Perrigo of Indianapolis, Indiana and Elder Rex Hunt of Fountain Run, Kentucky as reading clerks.

After the reading of a portion of the letters, it was moved that we adjourn one hour for dinner. The motion carried. After announcements, Elder E.G. Williams offered the benediction and thanks for the meal.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON

After a bountiful meal and an hour of fellowship, we came together with singing led by Bro. Willie Moore, accompanied at the piano by Bro. J.W. Gregory. "I Can Tell You The Time" and "I Know I'm Saved" were sung. The moderator read II Timothy 1:1-7 for a devotional lesson. Elder James H. Smith, who had recently returned from his work in California, led the congregation in prayer.

The reading of the church letters was resumed.

Moved and seconded the Order of Business be adopted. The motion carried. The following report on Missions was read by Elder Bobby Pitt:

MISSIONS

Jesus Christ, our Lord and Saviour, was no doubt a missionary. He had been sent by the Father to do a work. In John 5:36 Christ said, **For the works which the Father hath given me to finish, the same works I do.**

A part of that work was the setting up of the Church. God gave it all the authority to see that the gospel was preached to all nations. God gave the authority and intrusted in it that great commission to teach, to baptize. Jesus said **teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you**, Matthew 28:19-20. Thus the church is to teach and practice the two ordinances that Christ put in it, being Baptism and the Lord's Supper.

But how can there be a church unless some God called missionary first preaches

the Gospel to sin sick souls in foreign or destitute place and souls were convicted and repented and were saved. Apostle Paul writing unto the church at Rome wrote, Romans 10, **How shall they believe in him of who they have not heard? How shall they hear without a preacher? How shall they preach except they be sent?** Sent by who or what. Called by God to preach the gospel, sent out by the Lord's church to do a work which is not finished.

Does God intend for the one sent out to do all the work. Not necessarily, according to the scriptures, one planted another watered. The Apostle Paul wrote unto the Corinthians in Cor. I 3:6, **I have planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the increase.** In Cor. I 3:10 Apostle Paul calls himself a master builder. Look what the scriptures say, Cor. I 3:10, **According to the Grace of God, which is given unto me as a wise master builder, I have laid the foundation and another buildeth thereon.**

Let the church see that they who it sends out are prepared. Let the one sent out examine himself in prayers and supplication and by all means prepare himself for the mission field. The scriptures teach us to do this. Be prepared II Timothy 2:15. The Apostle Paul wrote unto the young preacher Timothy, **Study to shew, theyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the Word of God.** Follow the leadership of the holy spirit by all means, both church and man. It can be so damaging to the Lord's cause and to the Lord's church when mission work is attempted, not according to the will of God.

Let's look at Jonah in the days of old. Jonah, First Chapter, the Lord told Jonah to go to Ninevah, but Jonah disobeyed and would flee unto Tarshish. Look what trouble he got into. But on the other hand, lets look what the scripture says in Romans 10:15, **How beautiful are the feet of them that preach the gospel of peace, and bring glad tidings of good things.**

As children of God and members of the Lord's church, it is our duty to pray as we have never prayed before, without ceasing for these God called. God sent missionaries, finance their work with every means possible. Don't let them want. Why? Because there are the ones who preach God's word in many, many times in places where the truth has not been heard before. Souls are convicted and saved, churches are scriptually organized, more missionaries are sent out and so it goes on and on according to God's plan from the beginning of time.

Somebody who was called by God to preach the gospel and was sent out by the old church to the mission field brought the gospel to the very part of the country we are now located in. This is why we are able this very day of our Lord, October 25, 1985 to be seated together as members of the Lord's church, representing many churches. Yes, a missionary was sent out by the church, thank God almighty for our missionaries. May the Lord be with them in power and strength.

We know that if God's people had not supported his work down through the years, we would be without the gospel and places of worship today. Malachi 3:8, Will a man rob God? Yet ye have robbed me. But ye say, wherein have we robbed thee? In tithes and offerings.

Financing the Lord's work goes back a long ways, even before the church came into existence as a body of baptized believers. We believe that we as God's people should give to finance the work, that more lost people might hear the truth. We give very little compared to what God gave to us. He gave His Son to hang and die that we could have everlasting life. He gave us everything.

The report on Church Discipline was read by Elder James W. Briley.

CHURCH DISCIPLINE

We, your committee, submit the following for your consideration.

When the word discipline is mentioned there are those who think of excluding someone from the church, but there is much more than this.

There are two kinds of discipline, namely, formative and corrective.

Let us look at formative discipline first. Formative: giving, or having the power and authority to go and make disciples, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost.

V. 20, Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you. Here's the beginning place for formative discipline, to one that's born again, the milk of the word is to be fed to them, a steady diet of the word of God is to be given to all. II Pet. 3:18 says, grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.

The very word disciple, means one who receives instructions from another.

There are those who say I don't believe in church discipline. Well, there is one that's never been taught the word of God. Because it plainly gives us all the instructions we need to be good ministers of the word.

We never out grow the need for formative discipline because we are still in this tent of clay and the flesh is rebellious to the things of the Spirit, see Rom. 8:7.

It is clear from the scriptures that Christians should ever be in a state of progressive spiritual improvement.

We see a clear picture in Heb. 5:11-14. Paul said, you have failed, you are dull of hearing. Is this not the condition of many today, still babies on the milk bottle?

The failure to receive formative discipline leads to the need for corrective discipline.

Does the church have the authority to administer corrective discipline? The answer is yes. Matt. 18, 15, 17 teaches us the steps to follow in private offenses, if the steps are followed and the two can't be reconciled, then tell it to the church.

Correction: the act of correcting, bringing one back from error, to a just standard, to regulate.

All corrective discipline should be done out of love, see Gal. 6:1. Restore the erring one in meekness and love, considering thy self, lest thou also be tempted.

Paul, to the church at Corinth, I Cor. 5:1,7, told them and us how to handle public offenses. V.4, when the church came together, not some secret back door conference. In the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, this means by the authority of the head of the church Jesus Christ.

There are two kinds of offenses, public and private. And they are to be handled differently. II Thess. 3:6, now we command you, brethren, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that ye withdraw yourselves from every brother that walketh disorderly, and not after the tradition which he received of us.

To discipline is to - educate, to give instruction, to inform, to correct, to chastise, to punish. To execute the laws of the church on offenders, with a view to bring them to repentance and reformation of life.

The church at Corinth did carry out Paul's instructions. It worked then and it will work today. II Cor. 2, Paul said you can now receive him back into your fellowship, the erring man of I Cor. 5:1.

When the church fails to teach and practice what we have been commanded to do, we are asking for the judgement hand of God to fall upon us today.

But let us always remember the instructions of Paul to the Corinthian Church, I Cor. 14:40. Let all things be done decently and in order.

Acts 10:34, of a truth I perceive that God is no respecter of persons. see Prov. 3:11-12.

Prov. 13:12, For whom the Lord loveth he correcteth, even as a father the son in whom he delighteth.

If the church fails to discipline, you can rest assured God will chastise the guilty ones.

See Heb. 12:5-8.

Acts 5:1, Ananias and Sapphira. The discipline was death naturally.

Yes, my God is righteous, He demands clean vessels.

Moved the report be adopted. The motion carried after spoken to by Elder James W. Briley.

The order of business was suspended as the time arrived for the Doctrinal Sermon. The congregation sang "I Can Tell You The Time," and the moderator presented Elder Harold D. Linville, the appointee, to preach the sermon.

Bro. Linville mentioned the good fellowship and harmony, sermons already preached and the good reports and discussions during this session of the association. He read for a lesson I Corinthians 12:1-18. His text was verse 13 of the lesson read, "For by one Spirit are we all baptized into one body, whether we be Jews or Gentiles, whether we be bond or free; and have been all made to drink into one Spirit."

The speaker referred to the many teachers and preachers who misinterpret this scripture, giving the proper usage as used in Acts 2. He then quoted from I Corinthians Chapter 13, showing the gifts which had ceased after serving their purpose, and then the three remaining ones, faith, hope and love.

Bro. Linville pointed out that the first and most important consideration of the text, was to be truly born again. He then spoke of immersion as the proper mode of baptism, speaking of Christ's baptism by John the Baptist, Matthew 3, Acts 8, Acts 9, Colossians 2:12. Again he reviewed the 3rd Chapter of Matthew, John's baptizing and authority, John 1:33, Mark 11:30.

The ministry of John the Baptist was expounded as also Luke 16:16 was quoted in relationship to the text. Some of those going to be baptized by John were refused baptism, not meeting the requirements, Matthew 3:7-9. Other scriptures referred to were John 3:22-23; Acts 2:41; John 4:1-12; Acts 1:22; Acts 9:18; Acts 26:12-19; Acts 10:44-48; Acts 16:14-15, 33. In all these scriptures the need to be saved through faith is a prerequisite for scriptural baptism.

Infants cannot be recipients of scriptural baptism, not being recipients of the gospel, Mark 1:3-5 and I Corinthians 15:1-4. Bro. Linville proved by the scriptures that all New Testament churches were composed of baptized believers, and that each church had its responsibility of discipline in her own body.

Each church is subject to Christ, Ephesians 1:21-22, and the proper way into a given church is in the study of the text of this message, I Corinthians 12:13. We were reminded that through scriptural baptism we say to the community and to the world around us that we have been saved and have manifested our desire to follow the Lord and to live and work for him. Truly this was a good sound doctrinal sermon. The congregation extended the hand of appreciation to Bro. Linville and to one another while singing "I'd Rather Be An Old Time Christian," "Leaning On The Everlasting Arms," "Just Over In The Gloryland," "I'm Bound For That City," "Amazing Grace" and "I Just Began To Live." Shouts of joy ascended from the midst of God's people to our joy and God's glory. After testimonies the congregation sang "Glad Reunion Day."

Moved to adjourn one hour for dinner. After announcements, Bro. Luther Jent from Denver, Colorado prayed the benediction and offered thanks for the meal.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON

The association enjoyed another bountiful meal and an hour of sweet fellowship. Services began with singing led by Bro. Charles Clariday accompanied at the piano by Bro. Bob Vanderpool. "Living By Faith" and "I Am His And He Is Mine" were sung. Elder Johnny Meador led in prayer and the moderator read Romans 1:8-12 for a devotional.

The order of business resumed and Elder W.E. Massey read the report on Resolutions.

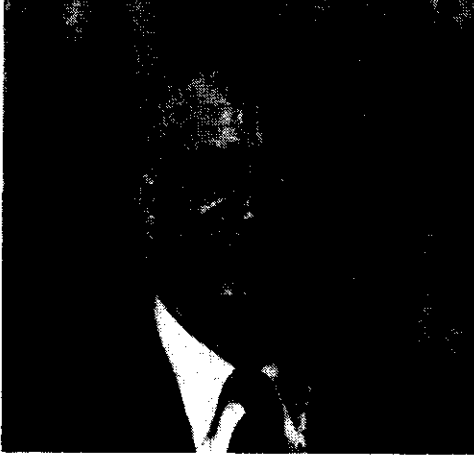
