CONSTITUTION

Article I. This body shall be known as Wiseman Association.

Article II. These Associations shall be composed of members duly chosen by regular and orderly Missionary Baptist Churches within our bounds.

Article III. The letters from churches to the Association shall give the number of members in fellowship, received by experience and baptism, received by letter, restored, excommunicated, and dead, since last annual meeting.

Article IV. Each Church shall be entitled to three messengers.

Article V. These Associations shall elect annually as officers, a Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer, whose duties shall be to serve their brethren in their several capacities.

Article VI. These Associations shall never interfere with the Independence of any Church, or claim any ecclesiastical power or rights of supervision over any of the Churches.

Article VII. It shall be the object of these Associations to promote the union of the faith of the Gospel with our educational and mission interests.

Article VIII. These Associations shall meet annually on Friday at 10 o'clock A.M., after the third Sunday in October, and continue two days, the meetings to be held at such places as may be agreed upon by the Association at its annual sitting.

Article IX. A majority of the members of any regular meeting shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Article X. It is expected that these meetings will be missionary in practice as well as theory.

Article XI. New Churches may be admitted into the Association who shall petition by letter and messengers, and on examination, if found orthodox and orderly, may be received and made known by the Moderator giving the right hand of fellowship to the Messenger or Messengers present.

Article XII. The Association may exclude from the union any Church or Churches that are heterodox in principle or disorderly in practice.

Article XIII. No proceedings shall be had against any Church except on charges preferred by a Sister Church, which shall first have followed the direction of Matthew 18:15, in attempting to bring it to repentance.

Article XIV. The Association, at its sitting may welcome any visiting brethren present, who shall have the liberty to join in the discussion of any report listed in the Order of Business, but shall have no vote in any action of the Association.

Article XV. Any alteration may be made to this Constitution at any regular meeting, by a majority vote of the members present.

Article XVI. That all questions arising before this Association be decided by a majority vote, except in the reception of churches into our fellowship, and that such reception be by a two-thirds vote.

Article XVII. If any church fails to represent one or more years, and then desires to reenter the fellowship of this association, there being, evidently, a reason for not representing, there must be a motion for their reentering the Association to be carried by a two-thirds vote. This action is to be taken after permanent organization and at the time to receive petitionary letters.

RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. The Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 2. A Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer shall be chosen annually to serve the Association.
- 3. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall arise and address the Moderator by the appellation of Brother Moderator, and shall, while speaking, confine himself to the subject under discussion and shall not be interrupted unless he digress from the subject; and shall in no wise reflect on any other speaker, so as to make remarks on his slips, failing or imperfections, but shall fairly state his views without sophistry or criticism.
- 4. No member shall absent himself from the Association without leave of the Moderator.
- 5. No member shall speak more than three times on the same subject without leave of the body. The chairman on each subject shall have an opening speech of ten minutes and two other speeches of five minutes each.
- 6. Each motion and second shall come under the immediate consideration of the Association, unless withdrawn by the one who made it.
- No member shall address another by any appellation other than that of Brother.
- 8. On the first day, immediately upon permanent organization, it shall be the duty of the clerk to read the Rules of Decorum. A roll call of messengers shall be made on the second day.
- 9. The Moderator shall be entitled to the same privilege of speaking as any other member, providing the chair be filled, but shall have no vote unless the Association be equally divided.
- 10. Any member violating these rules, or at any time manifesting a spirit contrary to the Gospel shall be reproved or such other course taken with him as the Moderator may think proper, either at his own option or the intimation of any other member.

V. OF JUSTIFICATION

We believe that the great gospel blessing which Christ secures to such as believe in him is Justification; that Justification includes the pardon of sin, and the promise of eternal life on principles of righteousness; that it is bestowed, not in consideration of any works of righteousness which we have done, but solely through faith in the Redeemer's blood; by virtue of which faith his perfect righteousness is freely imputed to us of God; that it brings us into a state of most blessed peace and favor with God, and secures every other blessing needful for time and eternity.

We believe that Christian Baptism is the immersion in water of a believer, into the name of the Father, and Son, and Holy Ghost; to show forth, in a solemn and beautiful emblem, our faith in the crucified, buried, and risen Saviour, with its effects in our death to sin and resurrection to a new life; that it is prerequisite to the privileges of a church relation; and to the Lord's Supper; in which the members of the church, by the sacred use of bread and wine are to commemorate together the dying love of Christ; preceded always by solemn self-examination.

FRIDAY - OCTOBER 24, 1986

On the above date, the Wiseman Baptist Association convened in its 96th annual session with Gateway Missionary Baptist Church, Lakeland Drive and McGavock Pike, Donelson, Tennessee.

Services began at 10:00 A.M. with singing led by Bro. Gary Green, accompanied at the piano by Bro. J.W. Gregory. "I Can Hear Them Singing Over There" and "The Light of That City is Shining For Me," were sung. The moderator read Isaiah 49:1-7 for a devotional and made remarks with reference to our purpose of meeting. He welcomed all visitors who were with us from various states and Baptist Associations. Elder Calvin Perrigo from the Bethel Baptist Association, now living in Lexington, Tennessee, led the congregation in prayer. After singing "I Will Be Glad," Elder Hilman Duncan, pastor of Gateway Baptist Church, spoke concerning the church's opportunity to host the association, and welcomed everyone.

The moderator presented Elder Ottis Jones to preach the Introductory Sermon. Bro. Jones expressed his appreciation for the privilege of preaching before the association, and asked for the prayers of the people.

He read for a lesson Daniel 2:31-35. His theme was "The stone that became a great mountain and filled the whole earth." This was used in the teaching of Christ's Kingdom, the New Testament church.

He began his message by speaking of Jesus calling out the disciples to follow him, recorded in Matthew 4. He spoke of the twelve apostles first and then the seventy disciples, Luke 10:1. He then read from Matthew 16:13-17. Here he spoke of Jesus and the dependence of his followers upon him. Verse 21 was discussed where Jesus taught his disciples more about his work and also their responsibilities to follow later.

Further in Jesus' ministry and journey of life, his work became more difficult, until Peter the lonely apostle, also denied him. Then came his crucifixion. Bro. Jones preached of Jesus' resurrection and his walk along the Emmaus road with two of his disciples, Luke 24: 13-31.

Christ had given the infant church, Matthew 28:19-20, a promise to be with it to the end of the world. Next discussed, was the great Spiritual blessings upon the church on the day of Pentecost, Acts 2. These blessings and power have remained with the Lord's church for the past two thousand years, even through great tribulations.

Bro. Jones spoke of the Spirit-led work of the church at Antioch, Acts 13:1-4, in sending out missionaries. This was a good Spiritual, sound sermon. While singing "I'll Look For You," "Amazing Grace" and "I've Started For The Kingdom," the congregation came forward and extended to Bro. Jones the hand of endorsement and to one another in Christian Fellowship.

The world recognizes many assemblies, congregations, gatherings, and some even try to recognize an invisible church. Our thoughts and our interest today is what God recognizes. For this answer we must look in God's word.

In Luke's Gospel 1:13, "But the angel said unto him, fear not Zacharias: for thy prayer is heard; and thy wife Elizabeth shall bear thee a son, and thou shalt call his name John." Verse seventeen says, "and he shall go before him in the spirit and power of Elias, to turn the hearts of the fathers to the children, and the disobedient to the wisdom of the just; to make ready a people prepared for the Lord." This is in fulfillment of the prophet Isaiah 40:3, and also Malachi 3:1-2-3.

So how did John prepare the material to constitute the first church? Again we let His word answer. Matt. 3:1,2 "In those days came John the Baptist, preaching in the wilderness of Judea, and saying, Repent ye: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." Then Matt. 3:8 says, "Bring forth therefore fruits meet for repentance." Genuine repentance produces life, Acts 11:18. Fruits is the evidence of that life. So fruits meet for repentance was called for and demanded by the first Baptist preacher, and should be today. This is the requirement so essential before a person can be baptized into the fellowship of a church. Bro. Russell spoke of the opportunity to preach this sermon as "an honor" and as "a burden." He read for his lesson I Chronicles 21: 8-17. His subject was "Church Discipline," Galatians 5:9, "A little leaven leaveneth the whole lump." Scriptures used at this time were Matthew 18:15; I Corinthians 5:11; II Corinthians 13:5 and Isaiah 30:1.

The two major thoughts were [a] Formative Discipline and [b] Corrective Discipline. He mentioned the fact that churches were failing on discipline which is very important to a church being what it should be in the service of God.

Formative discipline is to be done through the proper teaching in the church. If it isn't, then the responsibilty of the church will be corrective discipline. If we exercise self-discipline as we should, then there will not be the need of church, or corrective discipline. Numbers 20:8 was given as evidence of this. Bro. Russell referred again to his lesson and how David had sinned against God in numbering the soldiers of Israel. David acknowledged his sin to God. Then the Lord gave him three choices of discipline, I Chronciles 21:10-12.

Bro. Russell spoke of the need of discipline in homes, churches, schools and various areas of our lives and communities. Scriptures quoted or referred to were Ecc. 10:18; Matthew 21:12; Galatians 2:11; Matthew 28:19-20 and Jonah 1:1-17. Here God's discipline of Jonah was given and its benefits to the people of Nineveh and God's glory.

Additional scriptures used were Proverbs 22:6; Jeremiah 7:16 and I Samuel 2:3. Bro. Russell firmly presented the fact that "What we sow, so shall we reap." He spoke of the sins of fornication, homosexuality in our land and the results.

He used Paul's statement in II Corinthians 10:4, that we need God's power in fighting sin and ungodliness. Bro. Russell did a good job with parables to teach us to exercise discipline, or pay the price. We thank God for these Bible truths.

The congregation came forward and gave to Bro. Russell the right-hand of fellow-ship in appreciation and endorsement of this good scriptural, sound Bible sermon on discipline while singing "I Feel Like Travelling On," "Amazing Grace" and "My Loved Ones Are Waiting For Me."

Moved to adjourn one hour for dinner. Carried. After announcements, Elder Benny Maggart prayed the benediction and offered thanks for the meal.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON

Once again we enjoyed an hour of fellowship and bountiful meal. Services began with singing led by Bro. Rhea Dyer accompanied at the piano by Sister Aleta Douglas. "Lead Me, Blessed Jesus," "God Will Wipe All Tears From My Eyes" and "Holy Spirit Come Again." Elder Larry S. Gregory led in prayer. The congregation then sang "His Commission Fill" and the moderator read Psalm 84:1-12.

There was a motion to rescind the adoption of the report on Resolutions as recorded in the 1985 minutes, (which action was taken during regular order of business due to the fact the current report was not present) and to have the current report read. Carried. (See report and discussion in regular sequence of reports).

NEW BUSINESS

Moved that Elder Hilman Duncan be recommended to the trustees of the Lafayette Baptist Orphans Home as a trustee from Wiseman Baptist Association for another three-year term. The motion carried.

Moved and seconded that beginning with 1987 session of the association, that in the reading of the church letters, after reading the heading of the first letter, then the only reading would be: A. Names of messengers B. The statistics C. Names of deceased D. Any remarks recorded. The motion carried.

Moved that the assistant moderator and assistant clerk prepare a proposed Order of Business for 1987, to be printed in these 1986 minutes. Carried.

A report was read of The Old Fashion Gospel Hour Telecast which was an annual report. It was read by Elder Bobby E. Pitt the Co-ordinator of the telecast. Moved the report be adopted. Carried.

Moved that beginning in 1987 the three sermons be video taped, if not objected by host church. The motion carried.

The minutes of the day were read by the clerk. Moved they be adopted. Carried.

Moved to adjourn to meet with West End Missionary Baptist Church, 440 West Main Street, Gallatin, Tennessee 37066, on Friday, October 23, 1987 at 10:00 A.M. The motion carried.

This was a wonderful session of Wiseman Missionary Baptist Association. The spirit and fellowship were great blessings with extended interests in various fields. We are thankful for the additional churches that come into our fellowship each year. We pray that the deep spiritual influence of this session will flow out into the hearts of our people to the conviction and salvation of lost souls, the edifying of God's people and to the glory of God.

After talks and announcements, Bro. Danny Cothron prayed the benediction.
