# CONSTITUTION

Article I. This body shall be known as Wiseman Association.

Article II. These Associations shall be composed of members duly chosen by regular and orderly Missionary Baptist Churches within our bounds.

Article III. The letters from churches to the Association shall give the number of members in fellowship, received by experience and baptism, received by letter, restored, excommunicated, and dead, since last annual meeting.

Article IV. Each Church shall be entitled to three messengers.

Article V. These Associations shall elect annually as officers, a Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer, whose duties shall be to serve their brethren in their several capacities.

Article VI. These Associations shall never interfere with the Independence of any Church, or claim any ecclesiastical power or rights or rights of supervision over any of the Churches.

Article VII. It shall be the object of these Associations to promote the union of the faith of the Gospel with our educational and mission interests.

Article VIII. These Associations shall meet annually on Friday at 10 o'clock A.M., after the third Sunday in October, and continue two days, the meetings to be held at such places as may be agreed upon by the Association at its annual sitting.

Article IX. A majority of the members of any regular meeting shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Article X. It is expected that these meetings will be missionary in practice as well as theory.

Article XI. New Churches may be admitted into the Association who shall petition by letter and messengers, and on examination, if found orthodox and orderly, may be received and made known by the Moderator giving the right hand of fellowship to the Messenger of Messengers present.

Article XII. The Association may exclude from the union any Church or Churches that are heterodox in principle or disorderly in practice.

Article XIII. No proceedings shall be had against any Church except on charges preferred by a Sister Church, which shall first have followed the direction of Matthew 18:15, in attempting to bring it to repentance.

Article XIV. The Association, at its sitting may welcome any visiting brethren present, who shall have the liberty to join in the discussion of any report listed in the Order of Business, but shall have no vote in any action of the Association.

Article XV. Any alteration may be made to this Constitution at any regular meeting, by a majority vote of the members present.

Article XVI. That all questions arising before this Association be decided by a majority vote, except in the reception of churches into our fellowship, and that such reception be by a two-thirds vote.

Article XVII. If any church fails to represent one or more years, and then desires to reenter the fellowship of this association, there being, evidently, a reason for not representing, there must be a motion for their reentering the Association to be carried by a two-thirds vote. This action is to be taken after permanent organization and at the time to receive petitionary letters.

# RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. The Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 2. A Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer shall be chosen annually to serve the Association.
- 3. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall arise and address the Moderator by the appellation of Brother Moderator, and shall, while speaking, confine himself to the subject under discussion and shall not be interrupted unless he digress from the subject; and shall in no wise refelct on any other speaker, so as to make remarks on his slips, failing or imperfections, but shall fairly state his views without sophistry or criticism.
- 4. No member shall absent himself from the Association without leave of the Moderator.
- 5. No member shall speak more than three times on the same subject without leave of the body. The chairman on each subject shall have an opening speech of ten minutes and two other speeches of five minutes each.
- 6. Each motion and second shall come under the immediate consideration of the Association, unless withdrawn by the one who made it.
- 7. No member shall address another by any appellation other that that of Brother.
- 8. On the first day, immediately upon permanent organization, it shall be the duty of the clerk to read the Rules of Decorum. A roll call of messengers shall be made on the second day.
- 9. The Moderator shall be entitled to the same privilege of speaking as any other member, providing the chair be filled, but shall have no vote unless the Association be equally divided.
- 10. Any member violating these rules, or at any time manifesting a spirit contrary to the Gospel shall be reproved or such other course taken with him as the Moderator may think proper, either at his own option or the intimation of any other member.

# NEW HAMPSHIRE CONFESSION OF FAITH 1. OF THE SCRIPTURES

We believe that the Holy Bible was written by men divinely inspired, and is a perfect treasure of heavenly instruction: that it has God as its author, salvation for its end, and truth without any mixture of error, for its matter; that it reveals the principles by which God will judge us, and therefore is, and shall remain to the end of the world, the true center of Christian union, and the supreme standard by which all human conduct, creeds, and opinions should be tried.

# II. OF THE TRUE GOD

We believe that there is one, and only one, living and true God, an infinite, intelligent Spirit, whose name is JEHOVAH, the Maker and Supreme Ruler of heaven and earth; inexpressibly glorious in holiness, and worthy of all possible honor, confidence, and love; that in the unity of the Godhead there are three persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost; equal in every divine perfection, and executing distinct but harmonious offices in the great work of redemption.

# III. OF THE FALL OF MAN

We believe that man was created in holiness, under the law of his Maker; but by voluntary transgressions fell from that holy and happy state; in consequence of which all mankind are now sinners not by constraint, but choice; being by nature utterly void of that holiness required by the law of God, positively inclined to evil; and therefore under just condemnation to eternal ruin, without defense or excuse.

# IV. OF THE WAY OF SALVATION

We believe that the salvation of sinners in wholly of grace; through the mediatorial offices of the Son of God; who by the appointment of the Father, freely took upon him our nature, yet without sin; honored the divine law by his personal obedience, and by his death made a full atonement for our sins; that having risen from the dead he is now entrhoned in heaven; and uniting in his wonderful person the tenderest sympathies with divine perfections, he is every way qualified to be a suitable, a compassionate, and an all-sufficient Saviour.

# V. OF JUSTIFICATION

We believe that the great gospel blessing which Christ secures to such as believe in him is Justification; that Justification includes the pardon of sin, and the promise of eternal life on principles of rightousness; that it is bestowed, not in consideration of any works of righteousness which we have done, but solely through faith in the Redeemer's blood; by virtue of which faith his perfect righteousness is freely imputed to us of God; that it brings us into a state of most blessed peace and favor with God, and secures every other blessing needful for time and eternity.

# VI. OF THE FREENESS OF SALVATION

We believe that the blessings of salvation are made freely to all by the gospel; that it

is the immediate duty of all to accept them by a cordial, penitent, and obedient faith; and that nothing prevents the salvation of the greatest sinner on earth but his own inherent depravity and voluntary rejection of the gospel; which rejection involves him in an agravated condemnation.

# VII. OF GRACE IN REGENERATION

We believe that, in order to be saved, sinners must be regenerated or born again; that regeneration consists of giving a holy disposition to the mind; that it is effected in a manner above our comprehension, by the power of the Holy Spirit in connection with divine truth, so as to secure our voluntary obedience to the gospel; and that its proper evidence appears in the holy fruits of repentance and faith and newness of life.

# VIII. OF REPENTANCE AND FAITH

We believe that Repentance and Faith are sacred duties, and also inseparable graces, wrought in our souls by the regenerating Spirit of God; whereby, being deeply convinced of our guilt, danger, and helplessness and of the way of salvation by Christ, we turn to God with unfeigned contrition, confession, and supplication for mercy; at the same time heartily receiving the Lord Jesus Christ as our Prophet, Priest, and King, and relying on him alone as the only and all sufficient Saviour.

# IX. OF GOD'S PURPOSE OF GRACE

We believe that Election is the eternal purpose of God, according to which he graciously regenerates, sanctifies, and saves sinners; that being perfectly consistent with the free agency of man, it comprehends all the means in connection with the end; that it is a most glorious display of God's sovereign goodness, being infinitely free, wise, holy, and unchangeable; that it utterly excludes boasting, and promotes humility, love, prayer, praise, trust in God, and active imitation of his free mercy; that it encourages the use of means in the highest degree. That it may be ascertained by its effects in all who truly believe the gospel; that it is the foundation of Christian assurance; and that to ascertain it with regard to ourselves demands and deserves the utmost diligence.

# X. OF SANCTIFICATION

We believe that Sanctification is the process by which, according to the will of God, we are made partakers of his holiness; that is a progressive work; that it is begun in regeneration; and that it is carried on in the hearts of believers by the presences and power of the Holy Spirit, the Sealer and Comforter, in the continual use of the appointed means, especially the word of God, self-examination, self-denial, watchfulness and prayer.

# XI. OF THE PERSEVERANCE OF SAINTS

We believe that such only are real believers as endure unto the end; that their persevering attachment to Christ is the grand mark which distinguishes them from superficial professors; that a special Providence watches over their welfare; and that they are kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation.

# XII. OF THE HARMONY OF THE LAW AND THE GOSPEL

We believe that the law of God is the eternal and unchangeable rule of his moral government; that it is holy, just, and good; and that the inability which the Scriptures ascribe to fallen men to fulfill its precepts arises entirely from their love of sin; to deliver them from which, and to restore them through a Mediator to unfeigned obedience to the holy Law, is one great end of the gospel, and of the means of grace connected with the establishment of the visible church.

# XIII. OF A GOSPEL CHURCH

We believe that a visible church of Christ is a congregation of baptized believers, associated by convenant in the faith and fellowship of the gospel; observing the ordinances of Christ; governed by His laws; and exercising the gifts, rights, and privileges invested in them by his word; that its only Scriptural offices are Bishops, or Pastors, and Deacons, whose qualifications, claims, and duties are defined in the epistles to Timothy and Titus.

# XIV. OF BAPTISM AND THE LORD'S SUPPER

We believe that Christian Baptism is the immersion in water of a believer, into the name of the Father, and Son, and Holy Ghost; to show forth, in a solemn and beautiful emblem, our faith in the crucified, buried, and risen Saviour, with its effects in our death to sin and resurrection to a new life; that it is prerequisite to the privileges of a church relation; and to the Lord's Supper; in which the members of the church, by the sacred use of bread and wine are to commemorate together the dying love of Christ; preceded always by solemn self-examination.

# XV. OF THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH

We believe that the first day of the week is the Lord's Day, or Christian Sabbath; and it is to be kept sacred to religious purposes, by abstaining from all secular labor and sinful recreations; by the devout observance of all the means of grace, both private and public; and by preparation for that rest that remaineth for the people of God.

# XVI. OF CIVIL GOVERNMENT

We believe that civil government is of divine appointment, for the interests and good order of human society; and that magistrates are to be prayed for, conscientiously honored and obeyed; except only in things opposed to the will of our Lord Jesus Christ, who is the only Lord of the conscience, and the Prince of the kings of the earth.

# XVII. OF THE RIGHTEOUS AND THE WICKED

We believe that there is a radical and essential difference between the righteous and the wicked; that such only as through faith are justified in the name of the Lord Jesus, and sanctified by the Spirit of God, are truly righteous in his esteem; while all such as continue in impenitence and unbelief are in his sight wicked, and under the curse; and this distinction holds among men both in and after death.

# XVIII. OF THE WORLD TO COME

We believe that the end of the world is approaching; that at the last day Christ will descend from heaven, and raise the dead from the grave to final retribution; that a solemn separation will then take place; that the wicked will be adjudged to endless punishment, and the righteous to endless joy; and that this judgement will fix forever the final state of men in heaven and hell, on principles of righteousness.

# FRIDAY - OCTOBER 21, 1988

On the above date the Wiseman Missionary Baptist Association convened in its 98th annual session with Goodwill Missionary Baptist Church, about five miles northeast of Hartsville, Tennessee in Trousdale County.

Services began at 10:00 A.M. with singing led by Bro. Rhea Dyer, accompanied at the piano by Sister Janice Gregory. "Amazing Grace" and "I Will Be Glad," were sung.

Elder Howard Taylor, the moderator, spoke of Goodwill church being his home church and his being saved here fifty-seven years ago. Also, that he was baptized into the fellowship of the church and later was ordained to the ministry by her authority. He welcomed all visitors who were present from several Baptist Associations in various states. Bro. Taylor read for his devotional lesson John 1:10-15. Elder W. T. Russell led in prayer. The congregation then sang "I Want To Sing In Glory Land."

Elder Guthrie Thompson, pastor of the host church, welcomed everyone to the church and the associational meetings. The moderator presented Elder Jeff Brown to preach the Introductory Sermon.

Bro. Brown expressed his appreciation for this opportunity. He read Ephesians 5:25, and chose for his subject "Christ also loved the church." He spoke of Christ's love for his church and gave it as an example of the love between a husband and wife. He expressed the need that we have as God's people, and as church members to express our love for the Lord and his church.

Bro. Brown emphasized the fact that the Lord's church consisteth not in beautiful buildings, yet we are thankful for them, but the living stones, which make up the church body.

The experiences that we have in church life which may be discouraging and seem defeating at times, often are the workings of the Lord for our good and his glory, the speaker declared. He also emphasized that Christ gave himself for his church and that he gives her his love. Certainly, he expressed, Christ cares for his own. Scriptures given during the message were Matthew 7:13-14; John 15:12-13; Acts 5:33-39; John 16:7-22 and II Timothy 4:6-8.

Bro. Brown spoke of how we should not waste our time in God's service and that we should manifest our love for the Lord as he has for us. In token of appreciation for this good message the congregation gave Bro. Brown the hand of fellowship, and to one another while singing "The Old Country Church On The Hill," "What A Day," "Victory In Jesus" and "When The Roll Is Called Up Younder."

# THE COMMISSION TO THE CHURCH

"Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world." Matthew 28:19-20.

Moved the report be adopted.

Elder Gary Duncan was then presented to preach the Memorial Sermon. Bro. Duncan made introductory remarks relative to this opportunity and read for a lesson Mark 14:3-9. His text was taken from Ecclesiastes 7:1, "A Good Name Is Better Than Ointment."

The woman ointing Jesus as recorded in the lesson read, thought not upon the price of the ointment, Bro. Duncan declared, but rather the purpose it served in recognition of the Lord. It is important that each one of us "do what we can."

As this woman took advantage of the opportunity given unto her, so should we take advantage of opportunities in mission fields or elsewhere. Our motives should be to honor and glorify the Lord.

At this point the speaker quoted the words of Jesus in Matthew 5:13. As salt is a preserving substance, so the church is the keeper and preserver of the doctrines and principles of the Lord's church.

Were seventy-one brothers and sisters who have departed from us the past year in death dedicated to God's service as they should have been? No doubt, the speaker said, some of them were.

Bro. Duncan referred to Josiah as recorded in II Kings 22, and that what he said about the needed repairs of the Lord's house, so we today, should mend the things among the Lord's churches that need to be mending. Isaiah said none considered that the Lord had taken away the righteous, and that from evil which was to come. Isaiah 57:1. Bro. Duncan referred to the scripture where the Lord rejoices at the death of the righteous. He also spoke of Stephen's message and departure from this life even while being stoned to death, and the joy he

experienced in that hour, Acts 7:54-60.

Bro. Duncan referred to John 21, and the appearing of Jesus to his disciples after his resurrection. Other scriptures given were Colossians 4 and Hebrews 10. This was a good sermon, in which it was emphasized that a good name is better than precious ointment.

In token of appreciation of this message, the congregation sang "What Will I Leave Behind" and "Glad Reunion Day" while giving Bro. Duncan the right hand of fellowship. Several good talks were made.

The motion for the adoption of the report on Obituaries carried.

Moved to adjourn until 10:00 A.M. Saturday. Carried. "I'll Shout With The Millions," was sung, after which Elder Gerald Cherry prayed the benediction.

# SATURDAY — OCTOBER 22, 1988

On the above date the Wiseman Association of Missionary Baptists convened on the second day of the 98th annual session. Services began with singing led by Elder Ron Galloway. Bro. Mark Harrison accompanied him at the piano. Songs sung by the congregation were "Heaven's Jubilee" and MY Hiding Place." The moderator spoke of the good singing and how God had planned his work through the ages, including the singing of praises unto his name. All visitors were welcomed to the services. Bro. Taylor then read for his morning's devotional John 1:25-33. Elder Calvin Perrigo led in prayer, followed by the song, "When I've Travelled My Last Mile."

The roll of messengers was read by the clerk.

The clerk read the minutes of Friday and Friday night services. Moved they be approved and adopted. Carried.

The report on True Repentance was read by Elder J.W. Briley.

# TRUE REPENTANCE

What is true repentance? The standard is found in the Holy Bible which is our guide. "for ever, O Lord, thy word is settled in heaven." Psalm 119:89. All scriptures is given by the inspiration of God. See, II Timothy 3:16.

Jesus said in John 14:6, "I am the truth and the life:" Since Jesuse said "I am the truth," then we must examine what he taught and what the Holy Spirit dictated to the writers of the Bible on the subject at hand.

True repentance, when it takes place in a sinner, he acknowledges he is wrong. I Thessalonians 1:9, "...how ye turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God." It's hard for the human race to say "I am wrong." Pride keeps man from true repentance. Repentance and faith are always mentioned in this same order when found in the Bible. These are inseparable graces, and are sacred duties of man as mentioned in the 8th Article of Faith.

What did Jesus teach on the subject? In Mark 1:14-15, Jesus preached his own gospel, saying, 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand: repent ye, and believe the gospel." In Luke 13:3, Jesus said, "I tell you, nay but, except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish." He repeats this in verse 5. We see that Jesus places emphasis on repentance, so should we.

John the Baptist preached repentance, Matthew 3:1. It had to be true repentance for he asked for 'meet' that is, evidence that they had truly repented. In Mark 6:7, Jesus called the twelve and sent them out to preach. What was their message? Verse 12, "And they went out, and preached that men should repent."

The scriptures we have used are showing man's need to repent. Why? Man is a sinner,

alienated from God. Let us take a look at some examples of true repentance. Recorded in Jonah 3, we are told of God sending a man to preach, the preaching that he bid him to preach. Jonah was called of God, and sent to a Gentile city. What was his message? "Yet forty days, and Nineveh shall be overthrown." Short, but bathed in the power of God. They believed God. This made the difference. "By the fear of the Lord men depart from evil." Proverbs 16:6.

There was fear shown in the record of Jonah 3. Why isn't there more contrition and sorrow shown today? Pride and no fear of God, Romans 3:18; Psalm 36:1. The definition of repentance, "To amend or resolve to amend one's life as a result of contrition for one's sins. The change of one's mind with regard to action or intended action. To feel regret, contrition for what one has done or omitted to do."

This describes Nineveh, does it not? "For godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation not to be repented of: but the sorrow of the world worketh death." II Corinthians 7:10. True repentance tends to life, "Then hath God also to the Gentiles granted repentance unto life." Acts 11:18. We have in the case of Nineveh true repentance. Jesus said in Matthew 12:41 that they repented.

There are so many examples in our Bible, which is our guide, we don't have time or space to mention them all. The prophets preached repentance, Jonah, John the Baptist, Jesus, the twelve apostles, the seventy, the one hundred, twenty preached repentance. The church still has the responsibility to preach it, II Peter 3:9; Luke 24:47; Acts 2:37-38 and Acts 20:21.

Most of our alotted space we have treated on repentance of the unsaved. But we see examples to the saved to repent, as Peter wept after he had denied the Lord. We, too, should repent when convicted of sin in our lives. In Revelation 2 and 3, the Lord said there were things wrong with five of the seven churches of Asia, and warned that repentance was needed. These churches had things wrong and needed correcting, so they could have fellowship restored with their head and founder Jesus Christ.

Today, when a church finds herself in error, there must be repenting. We say to you who may read this article, search the scriptures on this Bible subject. Let us be more determined to preach true repentance in the future, as we have time left until the coming of our great Saviour.

Due to the time arriving for the Doctrinal Sermon, it was moved to suspend the discussion of the report just read until after dinner. Carried.

The congregation sang "The Unclouded Day," and the moderator presented Elder Hilman Duncan to preach the Doctrinal Sermon. Bro. Duncan expressed his appreciation for the opportunity of this hour. He asked for the prayers of God's people.

He read for his lesson Proverbs 9:1-18, his theme being "Wisdom hath builded her house." Bro. Duncan began his message by speaking of God's plan for mankind from the beginning, Genesis 3:15. Speaking of Jesus' temptations, Matthew 4:1-11; Luke 22:39-46, he said Jesus proved himself worthy to die for our sins. The prophets of old, as recorded in the Old Testament, spoke of Christ's coming to fulfill the law.

Bro. Duncan spoke of the church of the living God as the house which wisdom had built. Solomon's temple was a type of the Lord's church. The material of which it was constructed

was made ready previous to the building. We, then, are living stones of which the Lord's church is built, manifesting the wisdom of God, I Peter 2:5; Hebrews 10:14; Ephesians 1:22.

He spoke of the fruitful years in the Lord's vineyard, and then the unfruitful ones seemingly, but that if we leave our preaching and its results up to the Lord and his wisdom, the results will be alright, Isaiah 55:6-11; II Timothy 3:16; Ephesians 2:8-10 and Hebrews 4:10. Bro. Duncan emphasized the importance of a born-again membership of churches. Also that all members had a place in the church, I Corinthians, and that this arrangement of cooperation in the church is by God's wisdom.

He spoke of the works of our churches and how God recognized them today, referring to Revelations 2, 3 and 4, and how he spoke to the seven churches of Asia. Through the wisdom of God, and our following the leadership of the Spirit, we can be victorious in the work of God. We as ministers should inspire our people as well as teaching them for their services in the kingdom of God. Bro. Duncan closed his message with Psalm 48:10-14.

The congregation extended the hand of appreciation to Bro. Duncan and to one another while singing "Jesus Saves," "Revive Us Again," "What A Friend We have In Jesus," "Oh, How I Love Jesus" and "Amazing Grace," in praises unto the Lord. More singing and good testimonies were heard.

Moved to adjourn one hour for dinner. Carried. Elder Terry Lyles prayed the benediction and offered thanks for the meal that had been prepared for our enjoyment and nourishment.

# SATURDAY AFTERNOON

Again, the large crowd in attendance at the association enjoyed an hour of fellowship while feasting upon the bountiful meal which had been prepared. The singing began with Bro. Dean Cornwell leading and Bro. Mark Harrison playing the piano. After singing "What A Lovely Name," Bro. Taylor read John 15:13-19, and asked Elder Thomas Smith from the Big Bear Creek Baptist Association in Alabama to lead in prayer. The prayer was followed with the singing of "I'll Fly Away."

The regular order of business was resumed with the discussion of the subject, True Repentance. The motion for adoption carried after spoken on by Elder J.W. Briley, Elder Johnny Meador and Elder Jerry Boze.

The Financial Report of the Lafayette Baptist Orphans' Home was read by Elder A.G. Gregory. Moved the report be adopted. Those speaking on the subject were Elder A.G. Gregory, Elder Hilman Duncan, Elder J.W. Briley and Elder Edgar Brown.




