CONSTITUTION

Article I. This body shall be known as Wiseman Association.

Article II. These Associations shall be composed of members duly chosen by regular and orderly Missionary Baptist Churches within our bounds.

Article III. The letters from churches to the Association shall give the number of members in fellowship, received by experience and baptism, received by letter, restored, excommunicated, and dead, since last annual meeting.

Article IV. Each Church shall be entitled to three messengers.

Article V. These Associations shall elect annually as officers, a Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer, whose duties shall be to serve their brethren in their several capacities.

Article VI. These Associations shall never interfere with the Independence of any Church, or claim any ecclesiastical power or rights or rights of supervision over any of the Churches.

Article VII. It shall be the object of these Associations to promote the union of the faith of the Gospel with our educational and mission interests.

Article VIII. These Associations shall meet annually on Friday at 10 o'clock A.M., after the third Sunday in October, and continue two days, the meetings to be held at such places as may be agreed upon by the Association at its annual sitting.

Article IX. A majority of the members of any regular meeting shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Article X. It is expected that these meetings will be missionary in practice as well as theory.

Article XI. New Churches may be admitted into the Association who shall petition by letter and messengers, and on examination, if found orthodox and orderly, may be received and made known by the Moderator giving the right hand of fellowship to the Messenger of Messengers present.

Article XII. The Association may exclude from the union any Church or Churches that are heterodox in principle or disorderly in practice.

Article XIII. No proceedings shall be had against any Church except on charges preferred by a Sister Church, which shall first have followed the direction of Matthew 18:15, in attempting to bring it to repentance.

Article XIV. The Association, at its sitting may welcome any visiting brethren present, who shall have the liverty to join in the discussion of any report listed in the Order of Business, but shall have no vote in any action of the Association.

Article XV. Any alteration may be made to this Constitution at any regular meeting, by a majority vote of the members present.

Article XVI. That all questions arising before this Association be decided by a majority vote, except in the reception of churches into our fellowship, and that such reception be by a two-thirds vote.

Article XVII. If any church fails to represent one or more years, and then desires to reenter the fillowship of this association, there being, evidently, a reason for not representing, there must be a motion for their reentering the Association to be carried by a two-thirds vote. This action is to be taken after permanent organization and at the time to receive petitionary letters.

RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. The Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 2. A Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer shall be chosen annually to serve the Association.
- 3. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall arise and address the Moderator by the appellation of Brother Moderator, and shall, while speaking, confine himself to the subject under discussion and shall not be interrupted unless he digress formt he subject; and shall in no wise refelct on any other speaker, so as to make remarks on his slips, failing or imperfections, but shall fairly state his views without sophistry or criticism.
- 4. No member shall absent himself from the Association without leave of the Moderator.
- 5. No member shall speak more than three times on the same subject without leave of the body. The chairman on each subject shall have an opening speech of ten minutes and two other speeches of five minutes each.
- 6. Each motion and second shall come under the immediate consideration of the Association, unless withdrawn by the one who made it.
- 7. No member shall address another by any appellation other that that of Brother.
- 8. On the first day, immediately upon permanent organization, it shall be the duty of the clerk to read the Rules of Decorum. A roll call of messengers shall be made on the second day.
- The Moderator shall be entitled to the same privilege of speaking as any other member, providing the chair be filled, but shall have no vote unless the Association be equally divided.
- 10. Any member violating these rules, or at any time manifesting a spirit contrary to the Gospel shall be reproved or such other course taken with him as the Moderator may think proper, either at his own option or the intimation of any other member.

NEW HAMPSHIRE CONFESSION OF FAITH 1. OF THE SCRIPTURES

We believe that the Holy Bible was written by men divinely inspired, and is a perfect treasure of heavenly instruction: that it has God as its author, salvation for its end, and truth without any mixture of error, for its matter; that it reveals the principles the true center of Christian union, and the supreme standard by which all human conduct, creeds, and opinions should be tried.

II. OF THE TRUE GOD

We believe that there is one, and only one, living and true God, an infinite, intelligent Spirit, whose name is JEHOVAH, the Maker and Supreme Ruler of heaven and earth; inexpressibly glorious in holiness, and worthy of all possible honor, confidence, and love; that in the unity of the Godhead there are three persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost; equal in every divine perfection, and executing distinct but harmonious offices in the great work of redemption.

III. OF THE FALL OF MAN

We believe that man was created in holiness, under the law of his Maker; but by voluntary transgressions fell from that holy and happy state; in consequence of which all mankind are now sinners not by constraint, but choice; being by nature utterly void of that of that holiness required by the law of God, positively inclined to evil; and therefore under just condemnation to eternal ruin, without defense or excuse.

IV. OF THE WAY OF SALVATION

We believe that the salvation of sinners in wholly of grace; through the mediatorial offices of the Son of God; who by the appointment of the Father, freely took upon him our nature, yet without sin; honored the divine law by his personal obedience, and by his death made a full atonement for our sins; that having risen from the dead he is now entrhoned in heaven; and uniting in his wonderful person the tenderest sympathies with divine perfections, he is every way qualified to be a suitable, a compassionate, and an all-sufficient Saviour.

V. OF JUSTIFICATION

We believe that the great gospel blessing which Christ secures to such as believe in him is Justification; that Justification includes the pardon of sin, and the promise of eternal life on principles of rightousness; that it is bestowed, not in consideration of any works of righteousness which we have done, but solely through faith in the Redeemer's blood; by virtue of which faith his perfect righteousness is freely imputed to us of God; that it brings us into a state of most blessed peace and favor with God, and secures every other blessing needful for time and eternity.

VI. OF THE FREENESS OF SALVATION

We believe that the blessings of salvation are made freely to all by the gospel; that it is the immediate duty of all to accept them by a cordial, penitent, and obedient faith; and that

nothing prevents the salvation of the greatest sinner on earth but his own inherent depravity and voluntary rejection of the gospel; which rejection involves him in an agravated condemnation.

VII. OF GRACE IN REGENERATION

We believe that, in order to be saved, sinners must be regenerated or born again; that regeneration consists of giving a holy disposition to the mind; that it is effected in a manner above our comprehension, by the power of the Holy Spirit in connection with divine truth, so as to secure our voluntary obedience to the gospel; and that its proper evidence appears in the holy fruits of repentance and faith and newness of life.

VIII. OF REPENTANCE AND FAITH

We believe that Repentance and Faith are sacred duties, and also inseparable graces, wrought in our souls by the regenerating Spirit of God; whereby, being deeply convinced of our giult, dnager, and helplessness and of the way of salvation by Christ, we turn to God with unfeigned contrition, confession, and supplication for mercy; at the same time heartily receiving the Lord Jesus Christ as our Prophet, Priest, and King, and relying on him alone as the only and all sufficient Saviour.

IX. OF GOD'S PURPOSE OF GRACE

We believe that Election is the eternal purpose of God, according to which he graciously regenerates, sanctifies, and saves sinners; that being perfectly consistent with the free agency of man, it comprehends all the means in connection with the end; that it is a most glorious display of God's sovereign goodness, being infinitely free, wise, holy, and unchangeable; that it utterly excludes boasting, and promotes humility, love, prayer, praise, trust in God, and active imitation of his free mercy; that it encourages the use of means in the highest degree. That it may be ascertained by its effects in all who truly believe the gospel; that it is the foundation of Christian assurance; and that to ascertain it with regard to ourselves demands and deserves the utmost diligence.

X. OF SANCTIFICATION

We believe that Sanctification is the process by which, according to the will of God, we are made partakers of his holiness; that is a progressive work; that it is begun in regeneration; and that it is carried on in the hearts of believers by the presences and power of the Holy Spirit, the Sealer and Comforter, in the continual use of the appointed means, especially the word of God, self-examination, self-denial, watchfulness and prayer.

XI. OF THE PERSEVERANCE OF SAINTS

We believe that such only are real believers as endure unto the end; that their persevering attachment to Christ is the grand mark which distinguishes them from superficial prefessors; that a special Providence watches over their welfare; and that they are kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation.

XII. OF THE HARMONY OF THE LAW AND THE GOSPEL

We believe that the law of God is the eternal and unchangeable rule of his moral government; that it is holy, just, and good; and that the inability which the Scriptures ascribe to fallen men to fulfill its precepts arises entirely from their love of sin; to deliver them from which, and to restore them through a Mediator to unfeigned obedience to the holy Law, is one great end of the gospel, and of the means of grace connected with the establishment of the visible church.

XIII. OF A GOSPEL CHURCH

We believe that a visible church of Christ is a congregation of baptized believers, associated by convenant in the faith and fellowship of the gospel; observing the ordinances of Christ; governed by His laws; and exercising the gifts, rights, and privileges invested in them by his word; that its only Scriptural offices are Bishops, or Pastors, and deacons, whose qualifications, claims, and duties are defined in the epistles to Timothy and Titus.

XIV. OF BAPTISM AND THE LORD'S SUPPER

We believe that Christian Baptism is the immersion in water of a believer, into the name of the Father, and Son, and Holy Ghost; to show forth, in a solemn and beautiful emblem, our faith in the crucified, buried, and risen Saviour, with its effects in our death to sin and resurrection to a new life; that it is prerequisite to the privileges of a church relation; and to the Lord's Supper; in which the members of the church, by the sacred use of bread and wine are to commemorate together the dying love of Christ; preceded always by solemn self-examination.

XV. OF THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH

We believe that the first day of the week is the Lord's Day, or Christian Sabbath; and it is to be kept sacred to religious purposes, by abstaining from all secular labor and sinful recreations; by the devout observance of all the means of grace, both private and public; and by preparation for that rest that remaineth for the people of God.

XVI. OF CIVIL GOVERNMENT

We believe that civil government is of divine appointment, for the interests and good order of human society; and that magistrates are to be prayed for, conscientiously honored and obeyed; except only in things opposed to the will of our Lord Jesus Christ, who is the only Lord of the conscience, and the Prince of the kings of the earth.

XVII. OF THE RIGHTEOUS AND THE WICKED

We believe that there is a radical and essential difference between the righteous and the wicked; that such only as through faith are justified in the name of the Lord Jesus, and sanctified by the Spirit of God, are turly righteous in his esteem; while all such as continue in impenitence and umbelief are in his sight wicked, and under the curse; and this distinction holds among men both in and after death.

XVIII. OF THE WORLD TO COME

We believe that the end of the world is approaching; that at the last day Christ will descend from heaven, and raise the dead from the grave to final retribution; that a solemn separation will then take place; that the wicked will be adjudged to endless punishment, and the righteous to endless joy; and that this judgement will fix forever the final state of men in heaven and hell, on principles of righteousness.

FRIDAY - OCTOBER 20, 1989

The Wiseman Baptist Association convened in its 99th annual session on the above date with New Bethel Missionary Baptist Church, 1080 Old Dickerson Pike, Goodlettsville, Tennessee. Services began at 10:00 A.M. with singing led by Bro. Bob Vanderpool, accompanied at the piano by Miss Robyn Vanderpool. "I Can Hear Them Singing Over There" and "When I've Traveled My Last Mile" were sung.

The moderator referred to our meeting and its purpose, and that this was the 99th annual session. He spoke of the former moderator, Elder Howard G. Taylor, who passed away two weeks after the 1988 session. He mentioned the fine qualities of Bro. Taylor and the good job he did while serving as moderator of the association.

The acting moderator, Elder James 'Pete' Porter, read for a devotional, Philippians 2:1-11. Elder Henry Smith led the congregation in prayer.

Elder H.C. Vanderpool, pastor of New Bethel Baptist Church, welcomed everyone including many visitors, from several churches, states and associations, on behalf of the host church.

"Home On The Banks Of The River," was then sung. The moderator introduced Elder Lonnie Meador, the appointee, to preach the Introductory Sermon. Bro. Meador expressed his thanks and appreciation for this privilege and opportunity. He read for his lesson, I Peter 2:1-10. His text was "The Rock of Ages." He spoke of the greatness of God and our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, who has been the Rock of Ages. Scriptures given at this time were, John 1:1; Genesis 28:20-22; Exodus 12:40-51 and Exodus 17:6.

As Bro. Meador continued his message he used other scriptures relative to his subject. Scriptures were given which referred to a rock, stone, either directly or indirectly referring to the coming Christ, the Rock of Ages, in a symbolic way, these being, I Kings 7:6-12; Daniel 2:44; Isaiah 7:14; Isaiah 28:16 and Matthew 1:22-23.

Bro. Meador spoke of the true way of salvation as believed and held to by true Missionary Baptists, referring to the preaching of John the Baptist, Matthew 3:1-17; Matthew 7:21-23; John 8:36; Ephesians 2:12-22; Revelation 1:17-18; Revelation 19: 6-9 and Revelation 22:16. In appreciation of Bro. Meador's message, the congregation extended to him the right-hand of fellowship and with one another while singing, "I Have Found The Way," "I Know I'm Saved," "Heaven's Jubilee," "Heaven Is Waiting" and "Victory In Jesus."

Paul said, "I am a debtor both to the Greeks, and to the Barbarians; Both to the wise, and to the unwise. So, as much as in me is, I am ready to preach the gospel to you that are at Rome also, "Romans 1:14. Paul was prepared of the Lord for the journey. The disciples were afraid of him. Act. 9:26. His friends turned against him and he was perscuted by the Jews and he was stoned and drew out of the city supposing he had been dead, Act. 14:19. Paul had a vision where to go in Acts 16:9. "Where there is no vision, the people perish," Prov. 29:18. Paul's spirit was stirred in him as he preached at Mar's Hill, Act 17:16-33. Paul declared all the counsel of God, Acts 20:26-27. The report on The Importance of Spiritual Leadership In the Churches was read by Elder Kenneth Woodall as follows:

THE IMPORTANCE OF SPIRITUAL LEADERSHIP IN THE CHURCHES

Each local church is to be guided and directed by the Holy Spirit. The Spirit always leads in keeping with the written word. When Christ, our head and founder, was here in person, he taught his church personally. Then he said in John 16:7, "It is expedient for you that I go away: for if I go not away, the comforter will not come unto you; but if I depart, I will send him unto you."

The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Godhead, and after Christ ascended to the Father, the church was filled with his Spirit in fulfillment of his promise. With his Spirit and power the church can be successful, and without it we become as sounding brass and a tinkling symbol.

We must pray in the Spirit, we must sing in the Spirit and the preaching must be in the demonstration of the Spirit and of power. We are a Spiritual house built up to offer up Spiritual sacrifices, I Peter 2:5. Christ said, "Without me you can do nothing." John 15:5. The Holy Spirit is available to us all. Read Luke 11:13, "How much more shall your heavenly father give the Holy Spirit to them that ask him:" May we all ask, in the manner that we might receive.

Services resumed at 7:00 P.M. with singing led by Bro. Bob Vanderpool, accompanied at the piano by Sister Dawn Vanderpool and the piano by Miss Robyn Vanderpool. Songs sung were "I'll Fly Away," "Homecoming Day" and "What A Meeting In The Air."

The assistant moderator, Elder Hilman Duncan, made some preliminary remarks concerning our great hope in Christ at present and of the great beyond. After prayer requests for the unsaved, the sick and troubled, Bro. Johnny Brewer led the congregation in prayer. The congregation then sang, "My Loved Ones Are Waiting For Me."

The moderator presented Elder Johnny Meador to read the report on Obituaries and to preach the Memorial Sermon.

TRUE REPENTANCE

Repentance means: 1) to feel sorrow, or self-reproachful for what one has done, or not done. 2) to feel such regret, or dissatisfaction over some past action, intention, etc. as to change one's mind about it. 3) to feel sorry, or self-reproachful for an error, sin, etc.

True repentance: In order to salvation. One cannot repent at any time he desires, but there are certain prerequisites to repentance. I believe repentance to be a gift of God, Acts 11:18, "Then hath God also to the Gentiles granted repentance unto life." Romans 2:4, "Not knowing that the goodness of God leadeth thee to repentance." John 6:44, Jesus said, "No man can come to me except the Father which hath sent me draw him." Now in order for God to

draw him, we learn that a person must first hear about Jesus through the gospel, which is the power of God unto salvation, Romans 1:16. The gospel shows unto us our lost condition, and how it strips us of all our self-righteousness, and shows us the remedy which God has provided for slavation.

This gospel must be preached in power, or accompanied by the Spirit in order to convict the soul. The Bible teaches the word to be the sword of the Spirit. When this word is empowered by the Spirit it cuts the heart, Acts 2:37-38, and brings Godly sorrow to work repentance to salvation. When one has repented and touched the Lord with the feeling of weakness, and Jesus pleads our cause to God, he grants faith to believe to the saving of the soul.

The true plan for salvation is to hear the gospel, repent to God, God will grant faith to believe in Jesus Christ to the saving of the soul. When we believe in Christ, God will accept us and place his Spirit within us, giving us a peace that is joy unspeakable and full of glory.

There was a motion to suspend the regular order of business for the Doctrinal Sermon. Carried. "Heaven Seems Real To Me," was sung and the moderator presented Elder J.W. Briley, to preach the Doctrinal Sermon.

Bro. Briley expressed his thanks for God's providence and mercies. He also offered thanks for the opportunity of preaching this message. He read James 3:1, for admonition. He then read for a lesson, II Chronicles 7:12-22. He chose verse 14 for his text, "If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land."

Bro. Briley pointed out that all truths as found in the scriptures and preached upon were recognized as "doctrine." Scriptures used were I Kings 6:11-14; Romans 15:4; Revelation 1:18; II Chronicles 6; Matthew 16:18; Mathew 12:40; Ephesians 2:19-22; Matthew 28:19-20; Acts 2:1-47; Acts 13:46 and I Corinthians 6:19-20.
